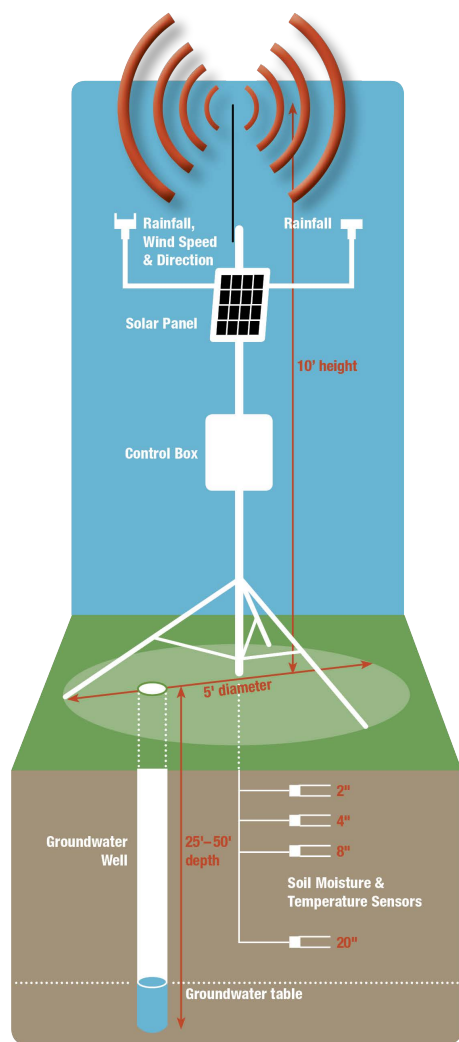
New Iowa Flood Center Weather Stations Forecast Flood and Drought
